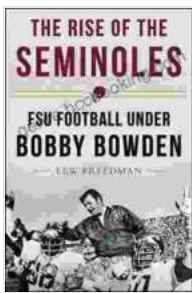

By 1987, Bowden had led FSU to its first national championship. The Seminoles defeated the Nebraska Cornhuskers 31-14 in the Orange Bowl to cap off a perfect 12-0 season.

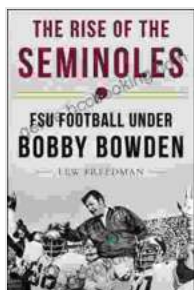
