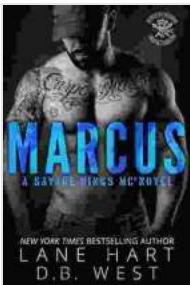


Marcus Savage: The King of South Carolina's Lowcountry

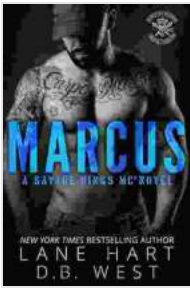
