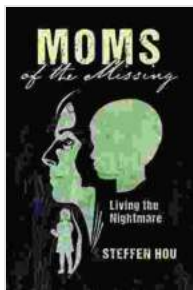


Moms of the Missing: Living the Nightmare

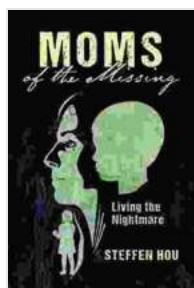

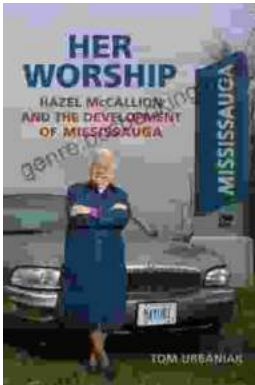
